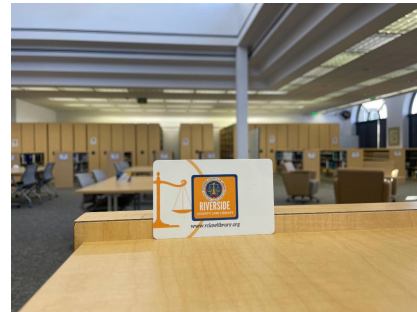

Introduction to HeinOnline's LGBTQ+ Rights

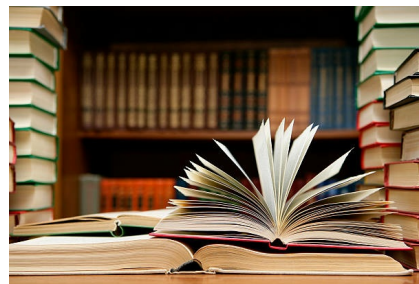
LGBT people have lived, loved, and thrived since humans first evolved. Written records of homosexuality, both thinly veiled and explicit, exist in all ancient civilizations, with the amount of openness afforded to homosexual, bisexual, and gender-nonconforming individuals varying from culture to culture. In Europe, persecutions of LGBT persons in a wide-spread, sustained way rose sharply during the Middle Ages (c. 500–1500), increasing during the Renaissance (c. 1300–1600), largely through the efforts and influence of the Roman Catholic Church. Sodomy was considered a grave sin, punishable by death under the Spanish Inquisition, in the Holy Roman Empire, and in Henry VIII's England under the Buggery Act 1533; homosexuality would remain a capital crime in England until 1861.

History is not linear or easily confined to neat narratives. While gay relationships were illegal and socially condemned in England in the 18th century, molly houses—taverns for gay and bisexual men and gender-nonconforming persons—began to (illegally) open throughout London and other large cities. France decriminalized sodomy in 1791. Anna Leto married her wife, Ann Walker, in 1834, solemnizing their
