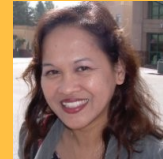


Director's Quarterly Update

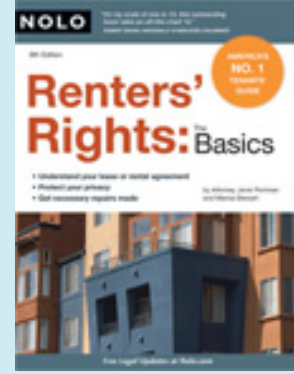
